Have the ability to communicate and co-operate by:

- ✓ Setting high expectations of all pupils and are committed to raising educational achievement.
- ✓ Wishing to work within a Church of England School and be willing to teach
- ✓ R.E. and attend collective worship to meet the expectations of the school's governing body.
- ✓ Adopting a flexible approach to working and enjoy being a good team member.

Knowledge and Expectations:

- ✓ Provide evidence of a good general knowledge and understanding of the National Curriculum and current strategies.
- ✓ The ability to plan and implement an effective teaching programme, including the assessment of the achievement of all pupils and maintain appropriate records.
- ✓ Seek to further develop personal professional skills and knowledge.

Teaching and Class Management:

- ✓ Have the ability to establish an effective rapport with children which is based on high expectations.
- ✓ Establish a purposeful learning environment where all pupils feel secure and confident.
- ✓ Use ICT effectively as an integral part of teaching and learning.
- ✓ Select and employ a wide range of resources with regard to safety issues.
